What type of tests are available?

Two types of tests for COVID-19 – rapid tests and PCR tests

Rapid tests (lateral flow tests)

- Fast and simple way to test people who do not have COVID-19 symptoms.
- 1 in 3 people infected with COVID-19 do not have symptoms, rapid tests are important in identifying these people.
- Easy to use and results are quick within 30 mins.



What type of tests are available?


PCR tests

- PCR tests are the gold standard, more accurate and can also detect the new variants of concern.
- Used for people who have symptoms of COVID-19, to confirm results of rapid tests and routine testing of some workforces (NHS and care sector)
- Laboratory needed to process the sample, results usually within 1 day.
- Accessed by ordering online from gov.uk or by visiting a test site.



What happens with the test result?

- All test results should be logged with NHS Track & Trace.
- Everyone who has a positive rapid test will need to go for a PCR test within 48 hours to confirm result.
- Contact tracing starts immediately when a positive rapid test result is logged with NHS Test and Trace.
- Positive tests triggers the legal requirement for self isolation for 10 days and access to support





What is the policy on rapid testing?

- Considerable expansion of rapid testing options over the last few months, and from 9th April
 - Rapid test available to adults and children (year 7+)
 - Encourage regular testing
 - 2x per week, 3-4 days apart
- Delivery of rapid testing supported by specific government testing schemes
 - Workplace (public & private sector)
 - Education sector
 - NHS and social care
 - Community testing sites (local authority run)
 - Online ordering (gov.uk)



How can businesses support testing?

Option 1: Set up on-site testing.

- DHSC scheme or private provision

Options 2: Distribute home test kits

- Workplace collect

Option 3: Signpost to other testing options

Testing can provide confidence to workers and customers, helping to protect and enable business continuity, and reduce the transmission of infection.

DHSC workplace testing scheme

- Employees cannot work from home
- Free rapid tests, support for setting up
- Submit results to DHSC

Private provision

- Companies to provide testing
- List of companies on gov.uk website
- UKAS accredited
- <u>Register to order free rapid lateral flow coronavirus tests for your</u> employees - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)



Option 2: Distribution of home test kits

- Workplace collect scheme
 - Employers with 10 or more employees
 - Order tests kits for employees to take home
 - 12th April deadline to sign up for the scheme
 - Employees responsibility to report results to NHS






Option 3: Signpost to other testing options

 - Order online
 - Community test sites
 - Community pharmacies

- Testing at a community site
 - Venues across Hertfordshire
 - Details on the council website www.hertfordshire.gov.uk

What can employers can do to support testing?

Leadership commitment

- Reinforce importance of testing to employees and business
- Staff briefings, Q&A, leaflets, discuss in key meetings

Communications

- Positive messages to remind staff to test and encourage uptake.
- E.g. stickers on boxes, reminder texts on day testing, intranet

Monitoring results (online portal)

- Consider asking staff to report results to business as well as NHS
- Leadership team to review results, identify required actions



What can employers can do to support testing?

Support from managers

- Regularly discussing with teams, supporting individuals who may need support with the process or have concerns.
- Maintaining other preventative measures rapid tests will not pick up all asymptomatic cases.
- Use the right test anyone with COVID symptoms needs a PCR test, not a rapid test.

• Encourage reporting

- Rapid reporting means close contacts can be identified quickly and we can stop the spread of infection.
- Reporting helps us identify where testing levels are low and where problems are emerging, workplace outbreaks and in communities.
